A large, active dumpsite located along Bowser Farm Road north of the town of Everett had been polluting the Raystown Branch of the Juniata River for years. Trash, tires, appliances, construction waste, a boat hull, a soda machine, and even a dog house covered the steep hillside. As soon as funding became available, a contractor was hired to remove the heavy concentrations, separating scrap metal from the tires and waste. Some buried debris was left intact as it provides stabilization to the roadway. All disturbed earth was seeded and mulched to help restore the natural quality to area.

Partners for the project include PA CleanWays of Bedford County, the township, and the Bedford County Conservation District. Adopters are being sought for long-term stewardship of this site.
