Prisoners from SCI Houtzdale made a positive impact in Cooper Township by removing and properly disposing of 20.04 tons of trash and recycling 378 tires from along Cooper Two and Peale Roads. Both roads had long been abused by illegal dumpers and contained just about everything imaginable including tires, furniture, mattresses, electronics, construction and demolition debris, recyclables, and household trash along their entire lengths.

The SCI Houtzdale Crew was led by the Clearfield County Solid Waste Authority, and Cooper Township provided much needed equipment and trucks for the week-long cleanup. In addition to the roads, illegal dumping along old mining roads were also cleaned.

Clearfield County was formed from parts of Huntingdon and Lycoming Counties in 1804 and named for Clearfield Creek. The creek's name alluded to an opening made by the large number of bison in the area. Clearfield County offers back woods, back roads, and back waters with plenty of recreational opportunities that all should be able to experience in a clean and safe environment.
