Forty-eight amazing volunteers worked tirelessly through light rain and fog to completely eliminate an active, illegal dumpsite located right at the Juniata—Perry County line on Route 74 just north of Ickesburg. The volunteers removed tires and many years worth of old trash. They even unearthed a culvert pipe buried by the trash, and as a result, tributary water once again flowed through the pipe and into the nearby stream. Saville Township donated equipment and manpower to help load the dumpster.

The illegal dumpsite is located on Pennsylvania Game Commission property (SGL 88) and sits almost at the top of the picturesque Tuscarora Mountain. The mountain was named for the Tuscarora Indians, a tribe adopted by the Iroquois Nation and allowed to migrate to this region around 1714. The area offers a rich diversity of rocky draws, hidden vistas, impenetrable greenbrier patches, mature forests, springs and streams, grassy slopes, and many other incredible flora and fauna. All of which deserves to be and now can be trash free.
